Section 2: Speaking

Exercise 1: Immigration Insights Forum

You will participate in a group discussion forum. You will be divided into groups of four. Each group will be assigned a specific immigration-related scenario. Your task is to discuss the scenario, considering its cultural implications and brainstorming possible solutions or responses. Prepare to present your insights to the class.

Immigration Insights



Scenario 1: A family from Venezuela has recently immigrated to Costa Rica seeking better economic opportunities. Discuss the challenges they might face in adapting to the new culture and suggest ways the community can support them.



Scenario 2: A group of Syrian refugees has resettled in Costa Rica due to the ongoing conflict in their home country. Explore the cultural differences they may encounter and propose initiatives to foster their integration into Costa Rican society.



Scenario 3: A multinational corporation is hiring foreign workers, including individuals from the United States and China, to fill technical positions in Costa Rica. Discuss the potential cultural clashes in the workplace and propose strategies for promoting cross-cultural understanding.



Scenario 4: A local NGO is organizing programs to assist undocumented immigrants in Costa Rica. Brainstorm ways to raise awareness about immigrant rights and advocate for more inclusive immigration policies in the country.

Cultural Entertainment Debate

CONTEXT

CULTURAL ENTERTAINMENT DEBATE

Traditional Team:

Defend the importance of preserving and promoting traditional Costa Rican cultural entertainment, such as folk music, dance, and storytelling. Argue that these forms represent the essence of Costa Rican culture, fostering a sense of identity and community pride.



Modern Team:

Advocate for embracing contemporary cultural entertainment trends, including pop music, movies, and digital media. Argue that modern forms reflect the evolving nature of culture and offer opportunities for cultural exchange and global connectivity.
