2. **a.** will / 'll | **b.** won't | **c.** won't | **d.** will / 'll
3. The technician won't replace the damaged screen until tomorrow.
4. 1 = **C** (Instant Decision), 2 = **A** (Future Prediction based on opinion), 3 = **D** (Offer of assistance), 4 = **B** (Refusal / Machine failure)
5. Model answers: AI will automate routine administrative tasks. / AI won't replace human critical thinking and creativity in leadership roles.
