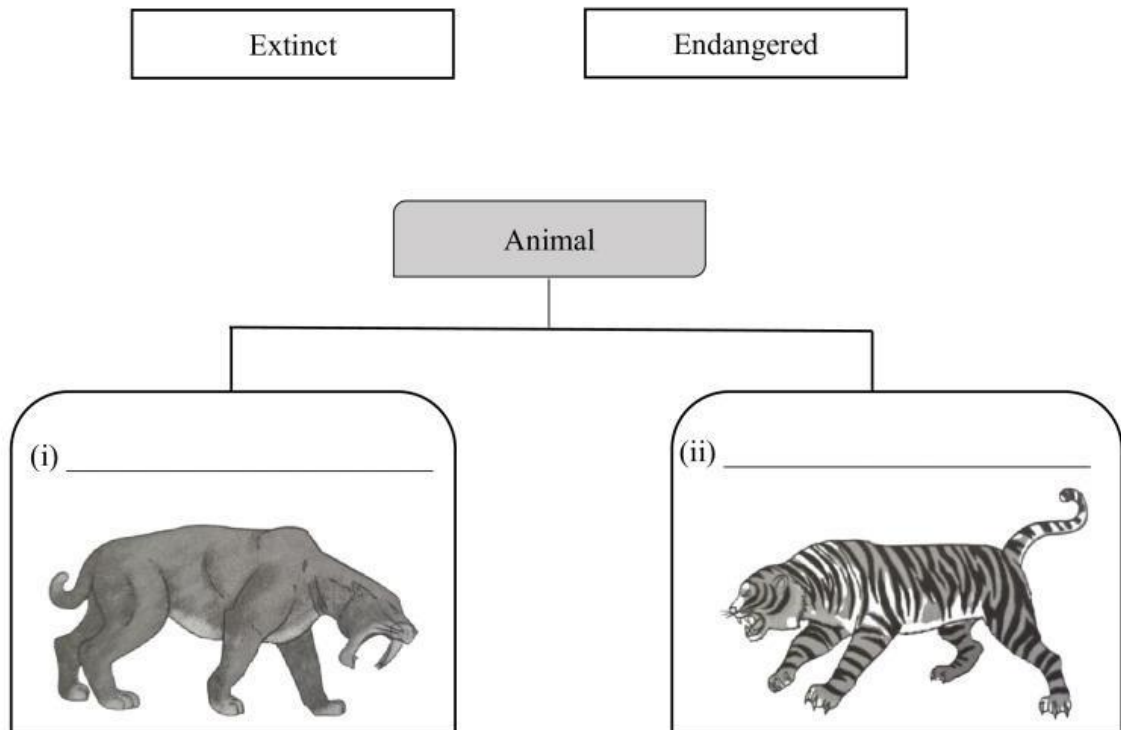

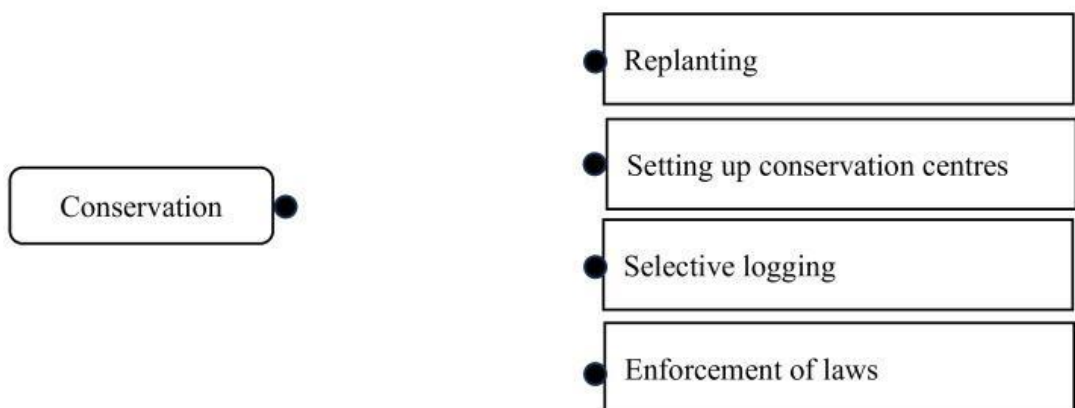

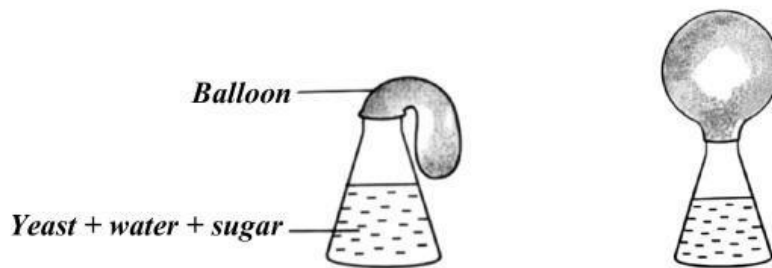

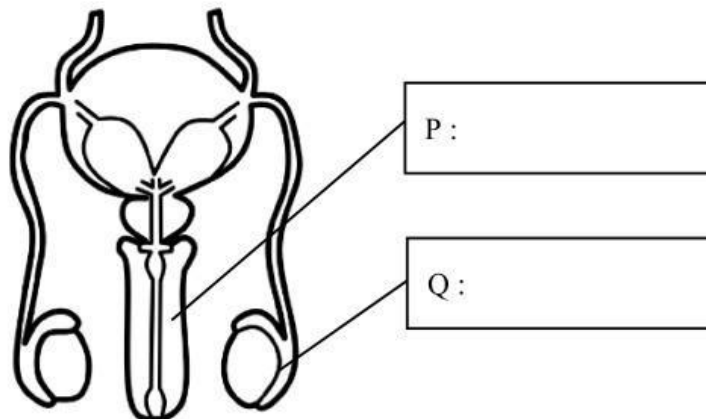

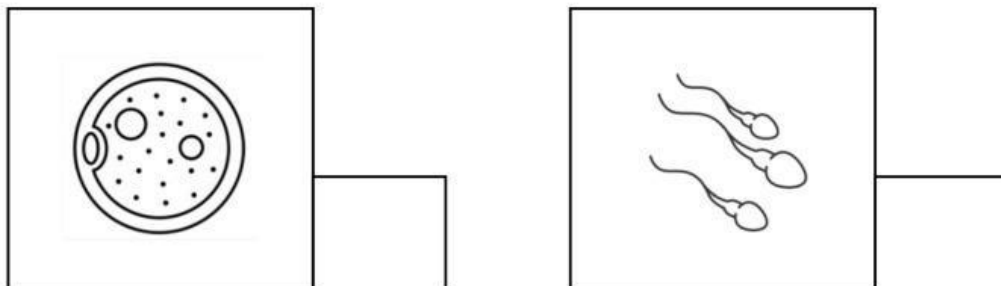
2. The diagram show the male reproductive organs.



a) Name P and Q in the diagram above.

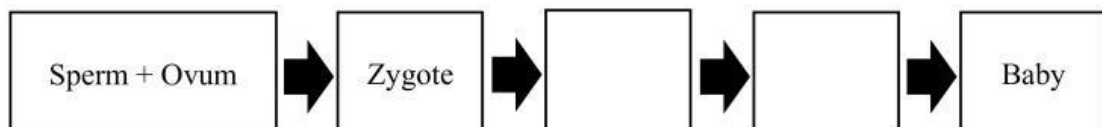
