1	climate	(n.)	the general weather conditions in a place over a long period of time
2	climate change	(n.)	long-term changes in temperature and weather patterns
3	global warming	(n.)	the gradual increase in Earth's average temperature
4	greenhouse gases	(n.)	gases in the atmosphere that trap heat, causing the planet to warm
5	carbon footprint	(n.)	the total amount of greenhouse gases caused by our actions
6	extreme weather	(n.)	unusual and severe weather events such as storms, floods, or heatwaves
7	drought	(n.)	a long period of time with little or no rain
8	flood	(n.)	an overflow of water that covers land that is usually dry
9	heatwave	(n.)	a period of extremely hot weather
10	sea level rise	(n.)	the increase in the height of the oceans
11	melting	(v.)	to change from a solid state to a liquid state due to heat
12	ecosystem	(n.)	a community of living organisms and their environment
13	biodiversity	(n.)	the variety of plant and animal life in a particular habitat
14	sustainable	(adj.)	able to be maintained without harming the environment
15	renewable energy	(n.)	energy from natural sources that can be replaced, like the sun, wind, or water
16	non-renewable energy	(n.)	energy from sources that will run out, like coal, oil, and natural gas
17	emissions	(n.)	gases or chemicals released into the air
18	pollution	(n.)	the presence of harmful substances in the environment
19	deforestation	(n.)	the act of cutting down large areas of forest
20	conservation	(n.)	the protection and careful use of natural resources
21	reduce	(v.)	to use less of something or to make something smaller
22	reuse	(v.)	to use something again instead of throwing it away
23	recycle	(v.)	to process used materials so they can be used again
24	habitat	(n.)	the natural home or environment of an animal or plant
25	adaptation	(n.)	the process of adjusting to new conditions
26	mitigation	(n.)	actions taken to reduce the causes or effects of climate change
27	awareness	(n.)	knowledge or understanding of a problem or situation
28	endangered	(adj.)	in danger of no longer existing
29	sustainable development	(n.)	development that meets our needs without harming the ability of future generations to meet theirs
30	zero waste	(n.)	a goal to send no waste to landfills by reducing, reusing, and recycling everything possible
