A. THEORY

I. GRAMMAR: MODAL VERBS

Modal Verbs

(Simple Rules for Everyday English)

Công thức nhanh

- S + should / must / need to / could + V
- S + shouldn't / mustn't / needn't / couldn't + V
- I would like + N / to V
- Would you + V ...?

Modal verb	Cách dùng	Ví dụ
should	Đưa ra lời khuyên (nên làm gì)	You should eat more fruit.
shouldn't	Đưa ra lời khuyên (không nên làm gì)	You shouldn't stay up late.
must	Diễn tả việc bắt buộc (phải làm gì)	You must wear a school uniform.
mustn't	Diễn tả điều bị cấm (không được làm gì)	You mustn't be late.
need to	Diễn tả sự cần thiết (cần làm gì)	I need to do my homework.
needn't	Diễn tả việc không cần thiết (không cần làm gì)	You needn't worry.
would	would like = muốn; Would you ...? = lời mời / yêu cầu lịch sự	Would you help me, please?
could	Diễn tả khả năng hoặc yêu cầu lịch sự	I could swim when I was 5.

1. QUANTIFIERS – BOTH, ALL

Dùng để chỉ cả hai hoặc tất cả.

Từ	Khác nhau	Công thức	Ví dụ
both	Dùng cho 2 người hoặc 2 vật.	both + danh từ số nhiều both of the + danh từ số nhiều	Both students are happy. 
all	Dùng cho 3 người/vật trở lên hoặc cả một nhóm.	all + danh từ số nhiều all of the + danh từ	All the books are new. 

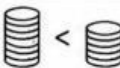
2. QUANTIFIERS – LESS, FEWER

Dùng để chỉ số lượng ít hơn.

Từ	Khác nhau	Công thức	Ví dụ
less	Dùng với danh từ không đếm được.	less + danh từ không đếm được	There is less water in the bottle. 
fewer	Dùng với danh từ đếm được số nhiều.	fewer + danh từ đếm được số nhiều	There are fewer cars today. 

3. QUANTIFIERS – NOT AS MANY, NOT AS MUCH

Dùng để so sánh số lượng ít hơn.

Từ	Khác nhau	Công thức	Ví dụ
not as many	Dùng với danh từ đếm được số nhiều.	not as many + danh từ số nhiều + as	I do not have as many pencils as Lan. 
not as much	Dùng với danh từ không đếm được.	not as much + danh từ không đếm được + as	He does not have as much money as his brother.

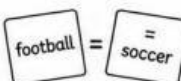

A A Busy Friday

These stories all happen during one day at a zoo. In the first story, zookeeper Mark enjoys spending time with monkeys and swimming with dolphins. My favourite is about a school trip that goes wrong – what happens to the children is scary.

B Zero Degrees Centigrade

Three families leave Europe and build homes in the hills and fields of northern Canada. Their only neighbours are bears and wolves. If you like horror stories, set 150 years ago, you'll love this book.

C The Long Summer

If you're interested in horses, you'll enjoy these stories because most are about horse racing and horse jumping. They were popular sports in the 1920s when the stories were written. You can also find out what farms were like a century ago.

D The Bell

These short stories are about classroom life for teenagers today. Find out what it's like for them in the countries they come from – such as Bangladesh and Peru. Some stories are sad and some are funny, but they're all beautifully written.

E Let's go!

In this first book by Sofia Hernandez, we read about some unusual school children who become famous footballers and tennis players. Some of their experiences are difficult, even frightening, for such young people, but there are also some very funny moments.

F Take my hand

This first book by 21-year-old Rashida Taylor takes us back to the 19th century and cities like London, Buenos Aires, Shanghai and Cairo. We see how the world was then through the eyes of a different ten-year-old girl or boy in each story.

G I Can Hear You

The first story in this wonderful collection is told by the main character – a tiger. The second is told by a penguin ... and so on. Their lives are amazing. Sometimes their adventures are dangerous, but usually they make you laugh.
