One of the most **pressing** issues in a smart city is the secure management of sensitive information. To make informed decisions, a variety of data—ranging from energy consumption to personal details like CCTV footage—must be collected. However, this raises concerns about data security and privacy. The local government must ensure that this information is handled with the highest level of security and is resilient against cyber attacks. Additionally, the collection and use of personal data by authorities can lead to increased social control, which poses significant privacy concerns.

Many companies in the smart city sector are relatively new, with business models that have not yet been fully tested or proven profitable. London, the capital of the United Kingdom, is recognized as the smartest city in the world. This achievement is largely due to the "Smarter London Together" initiative led by Mayor Sadiq Khan, **which** outlines goals for enhancing the city's infrastructure. The strategy focuses heavily on improving traffic flow and reducing congestion through technologies such as the congestion charge, contactless payment, and the ultra-low emission zone. Data collected from cameras and sensors helps manage these systems. Additionally, London encourages walking by providing an app with walking routes, aiming for 80% of journeys to be on foot, by bicycle, or via public transport. The city also supports businesses in the smart city sector by making **extensive** city data available for developing new technologies.

New York, the most populous city in the United States, is another leader in smart city development. Facing challenges related to environmental sustainability, New York launched the Smart Cities Programme, upgrading over 600 government buildings with energy-saving LED lighting systems. Smart meters were also installed in various properties to maintain sustainable water use, with sensors that alert residents to leaks. Air-quality sensors and an **optimized** traffic control system further enhance the city's environment. New York also supports smart city innovations through the Smart Cities Innovation Partnership, offering up to \$1 million in funding to companies developing new technologies.

Paris ranks as the third smartest city globally according to the IESE Index. The city has made significant strides toward becoming a smart and sustainable metropolis, particularly in response to issues like low air quality, limited green spaces, and high congestion. To improve air quality, Paris promotes electric cars and public transport, with Renault testing an induction charging system for easier car charging. Paris is also transforming into a "15-minute

city," where all essential services are within a 15-minute walk. Efforts to green the city include the creation of the largest urban farm, with plans for more parks and roof gardens.

Vietnam is rapidly advancing in smart city development, with efforts **accelerating** due to the COVID-19 pandemic and increasing awareness of the importance of sustainable urban spaces. Major cities like Ho Chi Minh City, Hanoi, Da Nang, and Can Tho are leading the way, developing smart city frameworks and gradually transforming city services. The government's Decision No. 749/QĐ-TTĐ, approved in 2021, provides guidelines for provinces and municipalities to formulate their smart city roadmaps. However, while smaller cities like Da Nang benefit from clear

paths to smart development, established metropolitan areas such as Ho Chi Minh City and Hanoi face challenges due to existing infrastructure.

Ho Chi Minh City has prioritized its smart city transformation with four key tasks: creating a shared database, establishing a simulation and forecasting center, developing a smart administration center, and enhancing information security. Initiatives like the Smart Urban Operation Center, **which** is supported by U.S. partners, and the Simulation Division for traffic management, highlight the city's commitment to integrating technology into its urban planning. The city is also fostering innovation by encouraging the use of open data ecosystems, providing accessible data on health, transport, and the environment for public and private use.

In addition to city-wide initiatives, district-level smart projects like Saigon Sports City and Thu Thiem Lotte Eco Smart City are underway in Ho Chi Minh City. These projects incorporate smart security, mobility, and environmental solutions, along with innovations such as green energy technology, intelligent buildings, and waste treatment systems. These developments reflect Vietnam's commitment to creating sustainable, high-tech urban areas, with collaboration between domestic and foreign partners playing a crucial role in this transformation.

Through these initiatives, Vietnam is positioning itself as a leader in smart city development, with a strong focus on sustainability and technological innovation across its key urban areas.
