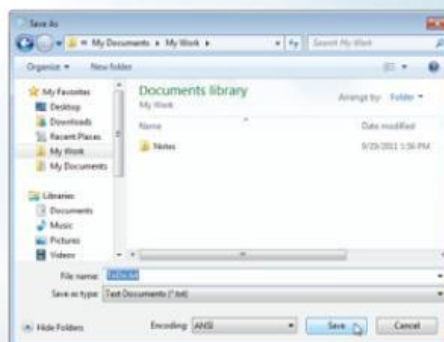

Save As 🖱️ It is used to save an already saved document or anything (which you want to save) with a new name.

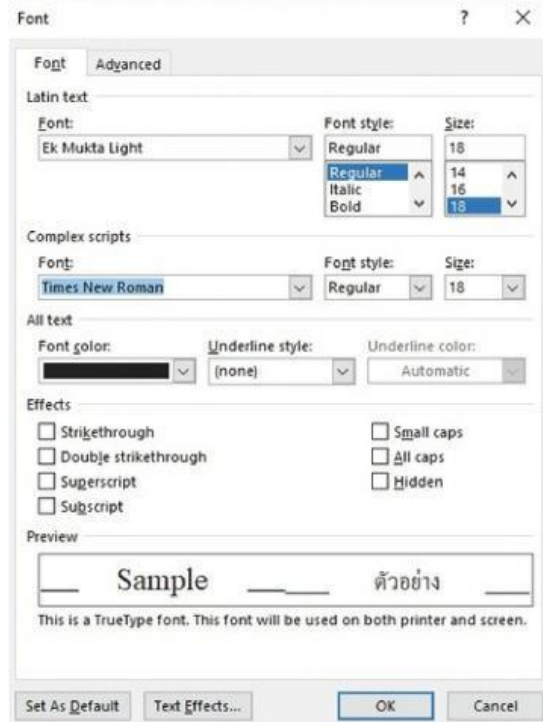

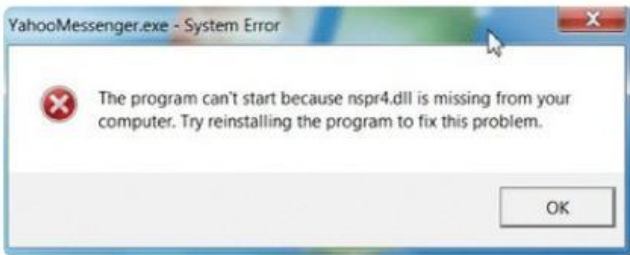

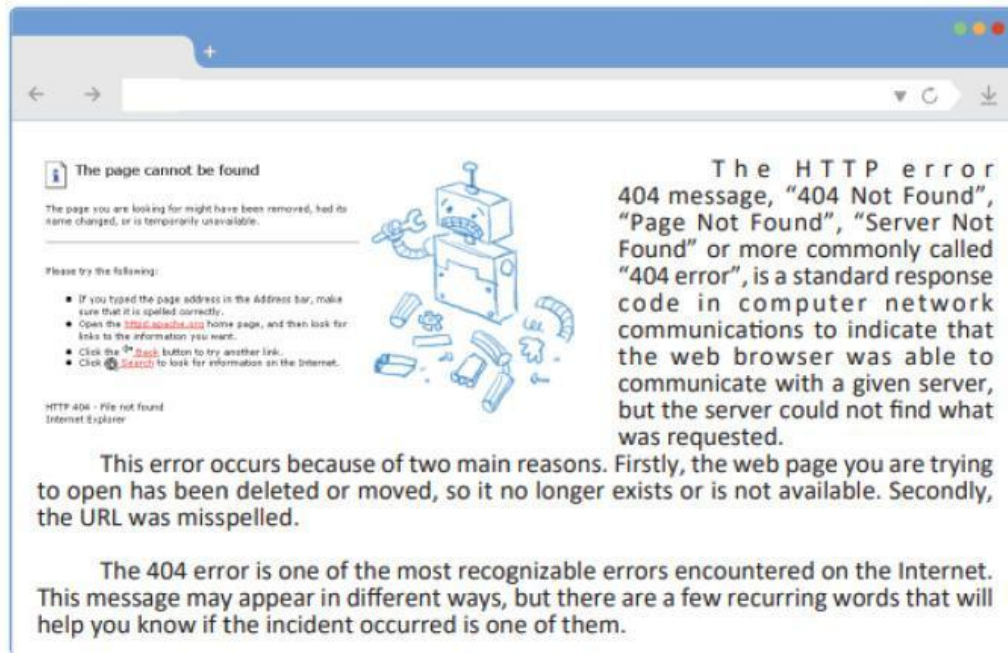

HTTP 404 - File not found
Internet Explorer

The HTTP error 404 message, "404 Not Found", "Page Not Found", "Server Not Found" or more commonly called "404 error", is a standard response code in computer network communications to indicate that the web browser was able to communicate with a given server, but the server could not find what was requested.

This error occurs because of two main reasons. Firstly, the web page you are trying to open has been deleted or moved, so it no longer exists or is not available. Secondly, the URL was misspelled.

The 404 error is one of the most recognizable errors encountered on the Internet. This message may appear in different ways, but there are a few recurring words that will help you know if the incident occurred is one of them.
