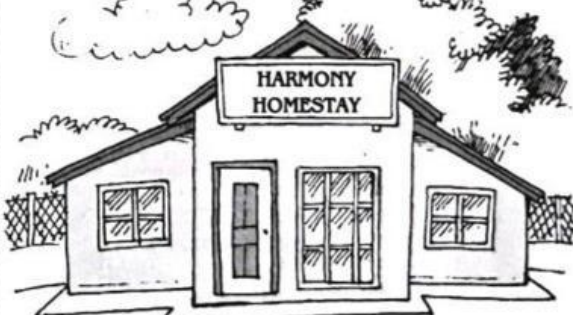

City Bicycle Tours

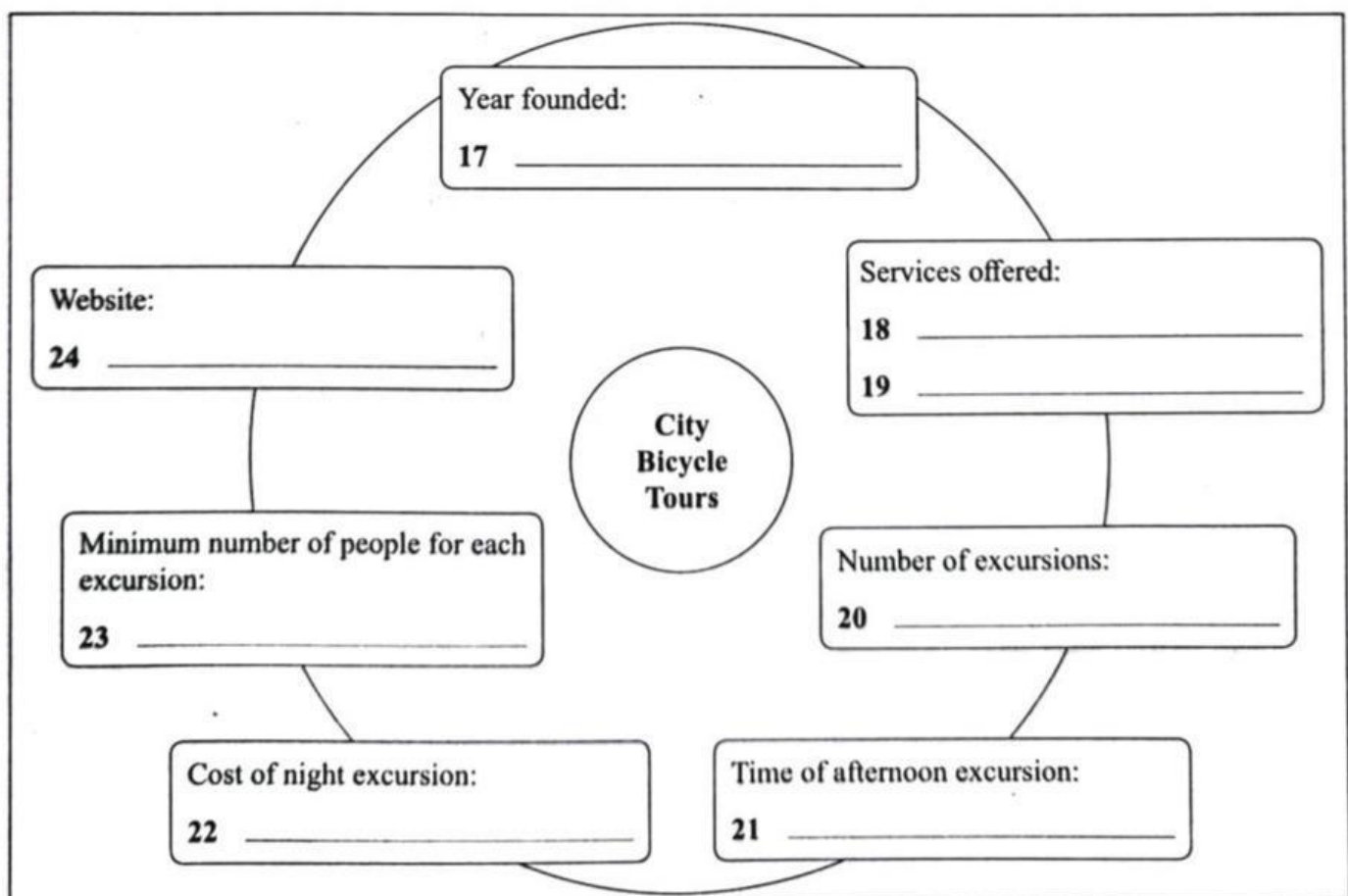

City Bicycle Tours offers biking excursions around the city. It also organises outdoor activities. Both types of services are led by experienced guides.

If you are worried that you do not have a bicycle of your own, City Bicycle Tours provides bicycles. The bicycles provided will suit each person's needs. The company has mountain bicycles, tandem bicycles and bicycles for pillion passengers, toddlers, babies, adults and seniors. Safety equipment, as well as water and snacks, will be provided. The company will pick up clients at their hotel and send them back after the excursion.

There are morning, afternoon and night excursions. Morning and afternoon excursions cost RM125 per person and the night excursion is RM185 per person. The fee includes a suitable bicycle, guides, a helmet, water and snacks. Each excursion requires a minimum of four people. The morning excursion starts at 8 a.m., the afternoon excursion starts at 3 p.m. and the night excursion begins at 7 p.m.

The company's top choice excursion lasts two days and one night. It costs RM485 which includes a suitable bicycle for you, guides, safety equipment, camping gear and meals. Amazing Houses Around the World

There are many types of unusual yet amazing houses around the world. These houses have unique designs. They are built using a variety of materials.

In Tokyo, there is a glass house which has been designed to let in as much natural light into the house. This 914-square-foot house looks like a tree house. It has several levels of living spaces. Though the house is bright and airy, it lacks privacy because the walls are made of glass.

The Hobbit House of Wales is another fascinating house to live. It is a charming-looking house just like the underground houses that the hobbits in the Lord of the Rings trilogy lived. The owner, with the help from his father-in-law and friends, built this eco-friendly house on the hillside. It took them four months to build it. He used materials from the nature such as oak, stones and mud to build the foundation. He put straw bales in the walls, floor and roof in order to insulate the house.

Another amazing house is the Clock Tower Penthouse. A penthouse is an apartment on the top floor of a tall building. It is fitted with luxurious furnishing and offers great views. This particular penthouse is a 6813-square-foot house on top of the Clock Tower Building in New York City. There is a 4.2-m glass clock facing every four walls of the living room. It has three levels. All rooms in the apartment, even the bathroom, offers a bird's eye view of the city.

One more interesting dwelling is the Kerek House. It is located in Warsaw, Poland. There are big, tall and small houses around the world but the Kerek House is known as the world's narrowest house. It is wedged between two buildings. It has two floors with one living area, one bedroom, one bathroom and a kitchen. It gets its electricity from the neighbouring building but has its own water and sewage technology. Even though Kerek House is used as a home, it is categorised as an 'art installation' because it does not meet specifications of the Polish building codes.

Friends vs Cliques

For certain people, close friendships are difficult to find. Teenagers especially face more challenges in choosing their friends. They have to choose their friends wisely. To help them do this, teenagers must understand the difference between friends and cliques.
