Sleep is often the first thing students sacrifice when exams approach, yet research consistently shows that this trade-off is counterproductive. During deep sleep, the brain consolidates memories formed during the day, moving information from short-term to long-term storage. Students who sleep fewer than six hours a night show significantly weaker recall than those who sleep seven to eight hours. Caffeine may temporarily increase alertness, but it cannot replace the memory-consolidation that occurs during sleep. Furthermore, sleep deprivation raises levels of cortisol, a stress hormone, which can increase anxiety — precisely the state that harms exam performance. The most effective strategy, according to sleep researchers, is a consistent schedule: going to bed and waking at the same time daily, including weekends, so that the body's internal clock remains stable.
