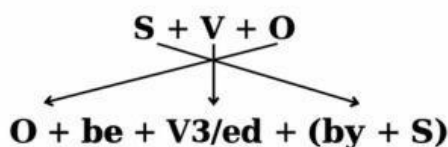

1. Present Simple Passive

	Công thức	Ví dụ
(+)	S' + am/is/are + V3/ed + (by + O')	Fast fashion is sold at discount stores.
(-)	S' + am/is/are + not + V3/ed + (by + O')	Plastic waste is not collected every day.
(?)	Am/Is/Are + S' + V3/ed + (by + O')?	Are these clothes made from recycled fabrics?

*Lưu ý: Có thể lược bỏ 'O' trong trường hợp sau:

- Chủ thể không quan trọng, không xác định hoặc chung chung

E.g: People sell second-hand clothes at discount stores. → Second-hand clothes are sold at discount stores.

- Chủ thể đã quá hiển nhiên (Ai cũng biết)

E.g: Teachers teach English in most primary schools. → English is taught in most primary schools.

Ví dụ	<i>This table is made of wood.</i>	<i>Paper is made from trees.</i>
