EXERCISE 5 – READING

THE SMARTER WAY TO USE AI

Artificial intelligence, or AI, is becoming part of everyday life for many teenagers. Students can see it in phones, video games, music apps, and social media. Some teenagers use AI to find information or learn new things. Others use it to create pictures, stories, or music.

For students, AI can be a useful learning tool. For example, it can explain a difficult word or help a student practice English. It can also give ideas for a school project. However, students should not simply copy everything that AI gives them. They still need to think and learn by themselves.

One teenager, Diego, started using an AI app to practice English. Every afternoon, he writes short messages in English and asks the app to correct his mistakes. At first, he made many mistakes, but he has improved. Now he feels more confident when he speaks English with his classmates.

AI can also be useful outside school. Some teenagers use it to plan trips, choose music, or learn how to cook. For example, an AI app can suggest a simple recipe with the ingredients that you have at home. This can save time and help young people learn practical skills.

However, there are some things teenagers need to remember. AI does not always give correct information, so users should check important facts. It is also important to protect personal information. Teenagers should not share passwords, private photographs, or other sensitive information with an AI app.

AI is changing quickly, and young people will probably see more of it in the future. The important thing is to use technology responsibly. AI can be a useful assistant, but it should not replace our own ideas, creativity, or decisions. Learning how to use it correctly can be an important skill for the future.
