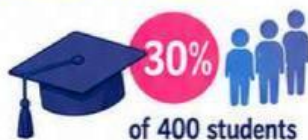

A Neighbourhood Full of Waste

In one neighborhood, waste collection is not managed effectively. Residents throw food scraps, plastic packaging, used bottles, and paper into the same containers.
