

QUANTIFIERS

COUNTABLE AND UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

- **COUNTABLE NOUNS** HAVE SINGULAR AND PLURAL FORMS, THEY CAN BE USED WITH AN ARTICLE A/AN AND THEY CAN BE COUNTED. EG: AN APPLE, TWO APPLES
- **UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS** HAVE NO PLURAL FORM, THEY ARE NOT USUALLY USED WITH AN ARTICLE, THEY ARE USUALLY NAMES OF SUBSTANCES WITHOUT A FIXED SHAPE
