



PRESENT SIMPLE: USE

Present Simple



Repeated Action

I eat lunch every day.



General Truths

Rain falls from the sky.

- we use the present simple to talk about our **habits**: “I study English every day”.
- We use the present simple to talk about facts or **truths**: “Children play with toys”.

PRESENT SIMPLE: FORM

When the subject is 'He / She / It' we add ___.

Subject	Verb
I	work
You	
He	
She	
It	
We	
You	
They	

When the verb is in the **negative form**, we need the auxiliary _____. We add the 's' ONLY to the helping verb in the third person singular.

Subject	Verb (negative)
I	don't work
You	
He	
She	
It	
We	
You	
They	

When we want to ask **questions** in the present simple, we need again the auxiliary.

Remember: the subject FOLLOWS the auxiliary.

Do / Does	Subject	Verb...?


When we want to give **short answers**, we need ONLY the auxiliary:

Yes,	subject	do / does
Yes,	I	do

No,	subject	don't / doesn't
No,	I	don't

PRESENT CONTINUOUS: USE

Present Progressive



- we use the **present continuous** to talk about **actions happening now** (or **around now**):
 - “You are reading this sentence”,
 - “My father is washing the dishes now”,
 - “It isn’t snowing today”.

Look at this sentence:

John works at a bank, but today he isn’t working.

John works at a bank → habit

Today he isn’t working → action happening now / around now

PRESENT CONTINUOUS: FORM

The **present continuous** is formed by the verb to _____ + the main verb in the - _____ form.

Subject	Verb to be	main verb (-ing)
I	am	working

In the **negative form**, 'not' has to be added to the helping verb: be.

Subject	Verb to <i>be</i> (negative)	main verb (-ing)
I	am not	working
You

When we want to ask **questions** in the present continuous, the subject **FOLLOWS** the auxiliary.
