Notes

1. Note this expression:
We might holiday in space one day – it's not beyond the bounds of possibility.
2. If something 'has possibilities', it means it has potential:
The house is a bit run down, but it has possibilities.
3. Both 'for' and 'of' can be used after 'possibility':
There's a possibility of snow.
The place has possibilities for development.
