

EASTER IN THE UK

Unlike Christmas, Easter isn't on the same day each year. It takes place on the first Sunday after the first full moon of spring. The students in the UK have about a two-week holiday at Easter time, which is almost as long as the Christmas holiday.

For most British children, Easter means chocolate Easter eggs. The shops are full of bright Easter displays decorated with chicks, rabbits and flowers. In the UK it's very popular to give the children chocolate eggs at Easter!

There are other traditions such as painting and decorating eggs to give as presents. Sometimes adults hide these coloured eggs as part of a game called 'egg hunt'. In this game kids have to find as much Easter eggs as they can and the winner is the one who has more eggs. Some places also do competitions to see who can roll an egg down a hill without breaking it!
