Present Perfect Continuous	Present Perfect
- Unfinished actions which started in the past and continue to the present – I have been living in London for two years. - Finished actions which have recently stopped and have a result – I'm so tired, I have been studying.	- Past actions that haven't finished – I have lived in Briston since 2009 (I still live there) - The action is finished but not the time – <i>I have lost my keys this morning (the morning hasn't finished yet)</i>
