

1 ROBBER ARRESTED

Yesterday, Bromwich Police Detectives arrested Timothy Burke Friday evening on charges of armed bank robbery, barely half an hour after the bank was robbed.

Timothy Burke, 24, was arrested at the intersection of Greets Green Rd. and Ryders Green Rd. The vehicle was stopped by a police officer for a traffic violation, and Burke attempted to run away. He was apprehended after a short pursuit. Among the items recovered inside the vehicle was the revolver used in the robbery, but the police found no money.

Police searched Burke's home, which happens to be around the corner from the bank, but the money - around £100,000 - is nowhere to be found.

Burke said he had buried the money and that nobody would ever find it.

2 POLICEMAN STABBED TO DEATH

Cleveland, O., March 28—Albert Sluka, a special policeman, was stabbed to death this morning. Harry Fegtal is under arrest charged with the murder. Sluka ejected some disturbers at a dance. After the dance Sluka joined a party waiting for a street car. He was attacked by two men and dropped in the street with an artery in his neck severed.
