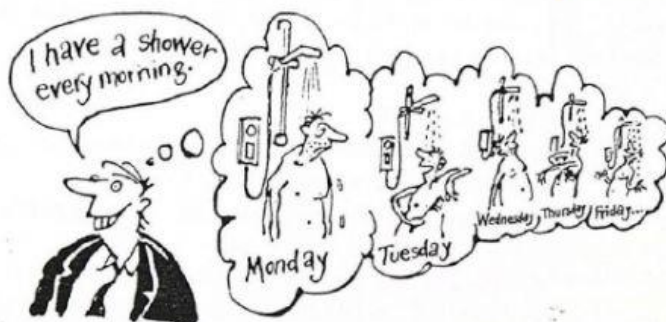

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COMPARE

PRESENT CONTINUOUS



We use the present continuous to talk about something that is in progress at or around the moment of speaking.

Are you working now?
Don't forget your umbrella when you go out. It's raining outside.

We use the present continuous for temporary situations and the present simple for permanent situations. Compare:
I'm sleeping on a sofa these days because my bed is broken.

PRESENT SIMPLE



We use the present simple to talk about repeated actions or habits, and things which are generally true.

Do you work every Saturday afternoon?
It rains a lot in Britain in March and April.

I always sleep eight hours every night.
