Pronunciation of ED



The pronunciation of words ending in ED depends on the final consonant (sound). There are three ways to pronounce ED:

/id/	/t/	/d/
<p>T wanted D needed</p> <p>Voiced Sound = uses the vocal cords and they produce a vibration or humming sound in the throat. (Touch your throat to feel it)</p>	<p>P helped K looked SH washed CH watched GH laughed TH breathed SS kissed C danced X fixed</p> <p>VOICELESS</p>	<p>L called N cleaned R offered G damaged V loved S used W followed Y enjoyed Z amazed</p> <p>VOICED</p>
