Reading Strategy: Recognizing Cause/Effect Text Structure.

Text structure is the way authors organize their writing. Each structure has distinctive characteristics that help the reader understand what writing genre is being used. In informational text and content area text books, the most commonly used text structures are cause and effect, compare and contrast, and description and classification (Pacific Resources for Education and Learning, 2008).

Causes and effects are part of our daily lives and are often found in academic texts. The terms "cause" and "effect" have Spanish cognates: "causa" y "efecto." If you learn how to recognize the cause/effect pattern when you read, it will help you to better understand academic text.

Example: I missed the bus this morning.

I was late for class.

What happened first?

What happened next?

I missed the bus.



I was late for class.

When you read text with a cause/effect pattern, ask: "What happened first?" Then you will know the cause.

for example:

Because I missed the bus, I was late for class.

cause → effect

I was late for class because I missed the bus.

effect ← cause

In both sentences, because is the signal word. It is found in the part of the sentence that tells the cause.
