



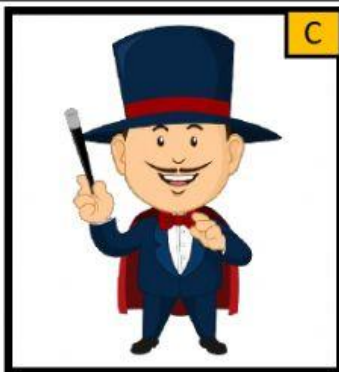

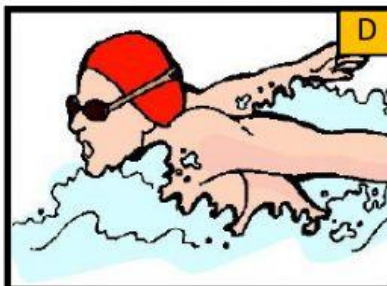
W.A. Mozart was born in Salzburg to a musical family. From an early age, the young Mozart showed all the signs of a prodigious musical talent. **By the age of five, he could read and write music, and he would entertain people with his talents on the keyboard. By the age of six, he was writing his first compositions, and by the age of eight had composed his first symphony.**



Garry Kasparov was born in Russia. He is considered by many to be the greatest chess player of all time. He was first introduced to chess when he was a young child. He took to the game seriously when he was just **six years old and began training. He won the Soviet Junior Championship at the age of 13 and won his first international tournament at the age of 16. And at the age of 22, he became the youngest ever undisputed World Chess Champion.**



David Copperfield was born in USA, by the **age of 10 he began practicing magic in his neighborhood. At 12 he was invited to join the Society of American Magicians**, so became its youngest member ever and began performing professionally. **At 16 was an adjunct professor at New York University, where he taught a course called "The Art of Magic" and when he was 39, he became the first living illusionist to be honored with a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, for the category "Live Performance"**



Michael Phelps is an American swimmer who holds the record for the most Olympics medals won by any athlete at 28, including 23 gold medals and 13 individual golds. Phelps **competed in his first Olympics at the age of 15, as part of the U.S. men's swim team. He was the first American male swimmer to earn a spot on five Olympic teams and also made history as the oldest individual gold medalist in Olympic swimming history at the age of 28.**
