

Proper Adjectives

RULES

A **proper adjective** is an adjective formed from a proper noun.

Tom is **Chinese**.

We flew the **American** flag.

The suffix -an, -ish, or -ese may be added to proper nouns to form proper adjectives. Notice that a proper adjective is always capitalized.
