We can use the structure **will + verb in infinitive** to talk about the future.

Watch a video that explains the form and the uses of **WILL** future.

We use WILL future:

- To make promises (nos comprometemos a hacer/no hacer algo en el futuro)
For example: ***I will not tell** anyone your secret.*
- To express spontaneous decisions (es algo que no planeamos con anticipación, sino que surge a partir de la interacción)
For example: *It's dark. **I'll turn on** the lights.*
- To make offers (cuando ofrecemos hacer algo para ayudar a otra persona)
For example: *That bag looks heavy. **I will carry** it for you.*
- To make predictions (para referirse a lo que creemos que va a pasar o no)
For example: *You didn't study. **You will not pass** your exam.*

3) Read the following sentences. What is the function of each? Colour the correct one.

- 1) It's getting cold. **I'll put on** a sweater. Promise / spontaneous decision / offer / prediction
- 2) A: Please, clean your bedroom.
B: Ok, mum. **I will do** that when I finish my homework. Promise / spontaneous decision / offer / prediction
- 3) You sing very well! I'm sure one day **you will be** a famous artist. Promise / spontaneous decision / offer / prediction
- 4) A: This Maths activity is very difficult!

B: I **will explain** it to you. Promise / spontaneous decision / offer / prediction

The form of **WILL** future is:

subject + will / will not (won't) + verb in infinitive

Examples:

Affirmative: He **will come** to the party.

Negative: He **will not come** to the party.

Interrogative: **Will he come** to the party? **Yes, he will. / No, he won't.**
