

## UNIT 6- Going to: time expressions

We use "going to" to talk about future plans.

We use time expressions to indicate WHEN we are going to do the activities.

1. Look at the time expressions in the following examples:



Today is August 16<sup>th</sup>. I am going to go swimming tomorrow (August 17<sup>th</sup>).

Today is the 9th day of the month. We are going to go on holidays next week.
