10. John phoned Sarah. He could invite her to his birthday party. (TO INFINITIVE)

11. James works overtime. He needs to improve his financial situation. (SO THAT)

12. Betty took a taxi yesterday. She wanted to be on time. (SO THAT)

13. The teacher worked on his lesson plans. He wanted to be ready. (IN ORDER TO)
