(not) as + adjective + as

"It's **not as big as** a normal computer."

affirmative	negative
I'm as funny as you are. He's as tall as his brother.	I'm not as tidy as my sister. He isn't as quiet as his dad.

We use **(not) as + adjective + as** to say things or people are (not) equal in some way.

"If we've got time, I'll show you how it works."

action/situation	result
If you plug it into a TV, If you don't write code,	you'll get a bigger screen, you won't get a job in IT.

result	action/situation
I'll be rich and famous He'll listen to you	if I learn to write code, if you talk to him.

questions	
Will he play on Saturday If I tell you the answer,	if we ask him? will you be happy?

We use the **first conditional** to talk about the future result of an action or situation.
