

The object of preposition

A preposition shows a relationship between ideas in a sentence. Prepositions usually answer the questions where or when. They often tell the location of a person or an object in time or space.

A Prepositional phrase begins with a preposition and ends with the object of the preposition.

Example: My family eats at this restaurant once a week.

Preposition at

Prepositional phrase at this restaurant

Object of preposition restaurant

20. After the practice, my coach bought us all ice cream.

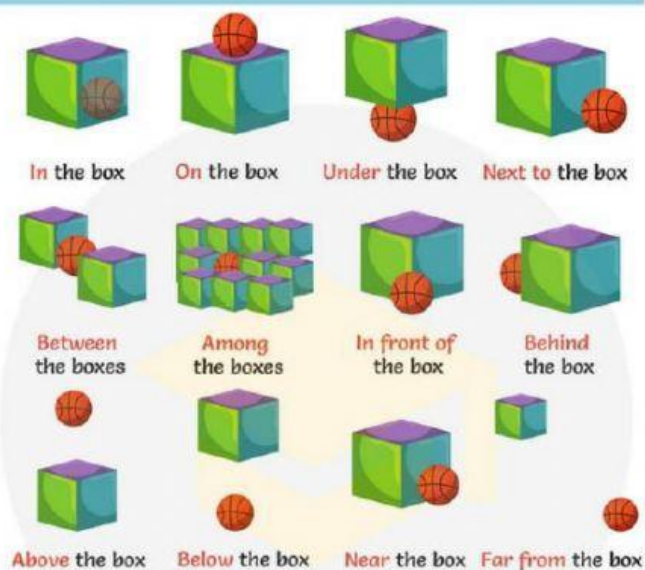
21. My little brother forgets to brush his teeth before school.
