Adjectives with one syllable, add: '-er' or '-r' + 'than'	cold "In Canada, winter is <u>colder</u> <u>than</u> summer."	Adjectives with two or more syllables, add: 'more' + 'than'	ex-pen-sive "This book is <u>more</u> expensive <u>than</u> that book."
Adjectives with two syllables that end in '-y', change '-y' to 'i' and add: '-er' + 'than'	hap-py "John is <u>happier</u> <u>than</u> David."	Adjectives that end in a single vowel and consonant: double the final letter before adding 'than'	big "Russia is <u>bigger</u> <u>than</u> Canada."
