CATEGORIES AND COLOURS

Irregular verbs with three identical forms (infinitive, past simple and past participle).

Verbs with identical infinitive and past participle forms.

Verbs with *-N* in the past participle and with *-O-* in the past simple and past participle.

Verbs with *-N* in the past participle and *-O-* in the past simple only.

Verbs with *-N* in the past participle, ending in *-EW* in the past simple and *-OWN* in the past participle.

Verbs with *-N* in the past participle, which don't appear to follow any pattern.

Verbs with pronunciation changes: long *E* in the infinitive changes to short *E* in the past simple and past participle.

Verbs with *-EA-* pronounced differently from the infinitive to the past simple and past participle.

Verbs with pronunciation changes: long *I* in the infinitive changes to *OU* in the past simple and the past participle.

Verbs with pronunciation changes: short *I* in the infinitive changes to *U* in the past simple and the past participle.

Verbs with pronunciation changes: *-AUGHT* and *-OUGHT* endings in the past simple and past participle.

Verbs with 3 different vowels: the vowel changes from *I* in the infinitive to *A* in the past simple and to *U* in the past participle.
