

Future Simple Passive Voice

Julia will eat lunch at one o'clock.

Lunch will be eaten by Julia at one o'clock.



- Step 1: the object becomes the subject
 Step 2: the verb to "be" replaces the main verb (was/were)
 Step 3: the main verb is written in the past participle
 Step 4: the subject goes after the verb using "by"



Chris will buy a new car.

A new car will be bought by Chris.

Andrew won't play chess at the club.

Chess won't be played by Andrew at the club.

Ted and Mary will give presents to the poor.

Presents will be given by Ted and Mary to the poor.

The tourists won't visit the islands.

The islands won't be visited by the tourists.
