A- THE CONTEXT - Read the text and answer the questions



The Freedom Riders

Freedom Riders were civil rights activists who rode Greyhound buses¹ into the southern United States to defy segregation with non-violence. Singing helped the Freedom Riders in the face of great danger, as they entered the city of Jackson, Mississippi.

In Jackson, the Freedom Riders were arrested and jailed² : "The prison officials wanted us to stop singing, because they were afraid our spirit would become contagious and the other prisoners would become Freedom Riders as a result of our singing." The guards threatened³ to take away⁴ the mattresses⁵ - their only luxury in a steel cell⁶ - if they continued to sing.

One Freedom Rider called for the guards and said: 'Come get my mattress. I'll keep my soul⁷.' And everybody started singing, « Ain't gonna let nobody turn me round, turn me round, turn me round... »

"They came in and took the mattresses away and people sang as they had never sung before. We thought we were winning the battle (...)"
