

**And** = links two related things (I like burgers and chips. I bought bread and jam.)

**But** = links a positive (+) and negative (-) idea. (I like films but I don't like plays. I like meat but I don't like fish.)

**So** = gives a result. (I was ill so I went to the doctor. I was hungry so I cooked a curry.)

**Because** – gives a reason (I went home because I was ill. I ate my lunch because I was hungry).
