Blog rules

A **blog** is a simple website. We **post** information, photos and **videos** there. Children around the world can read it. They can post information on it, too.

Here are some blog rules:


- Make an **avatar** for each of you.
- Create a profile and write some information about you.
- Don't put your surname or your telephone number on the blog. Create a **username**.
- Before you **upload** any photos or videos, ask permission from the people in them.
- Be careful what you post on the blog. Don't post anything unkind about other people.

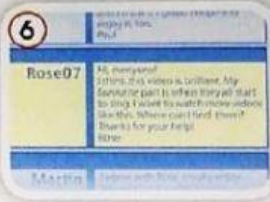
