- The words **better** and **worse** are used to compare **two** things.

The animal exhibits were better than last year.

The performers were worse than the year before.

- The words **best** and **worst** are used to compare **more than two** things.

The roller coaster is the best ride of all.

The Ferris wheel is the worst ride of all.
