Punctuation	Each sentence has ending punctuation.
	I read this piece of writing aloud to see where to stop or pause for periods, exclamation marks, questions marks, and commas.
	Lists of three or more items contain commas. (Example: For breakfast I ate an apple, banana, and mango.)
	Quotation marks are used when someone is speaking. (Example: She said, "I love ice cream!")
Capital Letters	Each sentence begins with a capital letter. Proper nouns begin with capital letters. (Example: Henry, San Francisco, Disneyland)
Grammar	Each sentence is a complete thought and contains a subject and predicate. I corrected run-on sentences by adding punctuation or conjunctions with commas.
Spelling	I circled words that were spelled incorrectly or words I wasn't sure about. (Hint: Use a dictionary or computer to find the correct spelling of circled words.) I checked the commonly misspelled words list and made corrections.

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
