

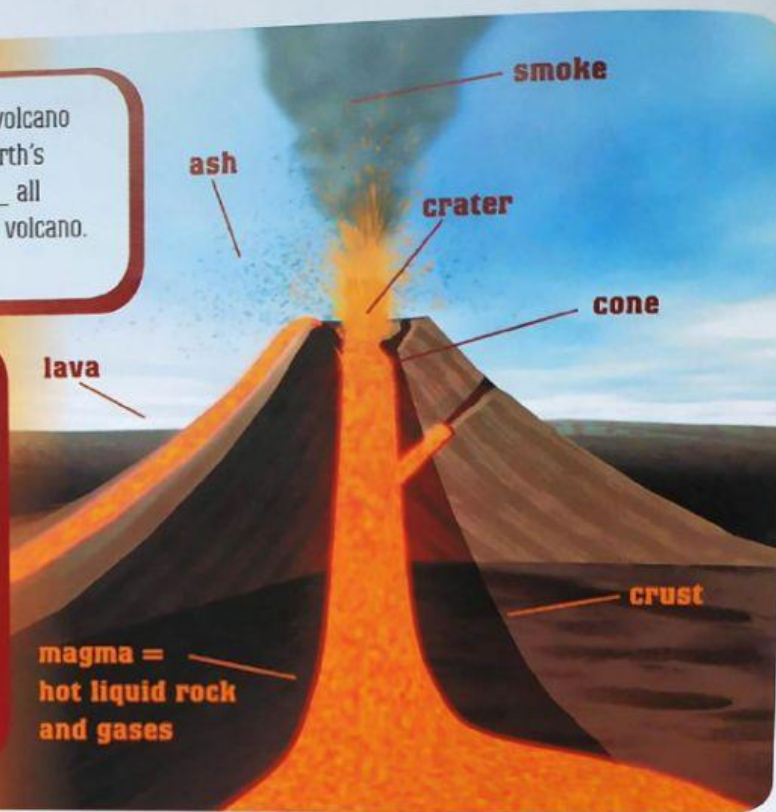

ROMAN TIMES MT VESUVIUS ERUPTS

MIDDAY 25TH AUGUST AD 79



At first the ash from Vesuvius – in the south of Italy – fell slowly. People didn't try to leave Pompeii. Suddenly Vesuvius erupted. Hot winds blew people to the ground. Ash covered them, and they couldn't breathe.

1,600 years later, people found the city of Pompeii (with its houses, skeletons, and food) under the ground. Historians learnt lots about Ancient Roman life from Pompeii. Vesuvius last erupted in 1944.
