

HAS AND HAVE

The verbs **has** and **have** mean “to own something.”

We use **has** to tell about one person, place or thing.

Clay **has** a pet.

We use **have** to tell about more than one person, place or thing.

We also use **have** with the words **I** and **you**.

Jan and Tim **have** a pet rabbit.

I **have** a frog.

You **have** a lizard.
