I guess that's why the weekend isn't so special for me – it feels the same as the rest of the week!'

#### Cloda from Ireland:

'I live on my grandad's farm in the countryside. It's lucky we've got a big house with lots of space because there are a lot of us living here. There's me, my mum and dad, my brother and sister, and my grandad and grandma. Oh, and my Auntie Noreen – she often comes for long visits and she's staying with us at the moment. I love it here. It's really beautiful – green fields and hills and birds singing to wake you up in the morning. But ... I don't like the farm jobs. Today I'm helping Dad and we're really busy. We're milking the cows. Then we're cleaning the barn and after that we're cutting the grass to make hay. Phew! Busy weekend ...'

Use *because* to say why:  
*I often take photos ... because it's got a camera.*

**Model Answer**

Show what you know. Use the adverbs of frequency you learned on page 13 to say how often you do things.

The *HOW TO* box on page 13 tells you where the adverb of frequency goes in the sentence. Remember:  
- adverbs of frequency go before the main verb  
- expressions of frequency go after SVO
