

## Second Conditional

If + Simple Past, + Would + Verb

Would + Verb + If + Simple Past

- If I **had** enough money, I **would go** to Japan. Or:
- I **would go** to Japan if I **had** enough money.

- 1 If I **won** / **would win** the lottery, I **traveled** / **would travel** the world.
- 2 I **visited** / **would visit** you if I **flew** / **would fly** to London.
- 3 If she **would pass** / **passed** the exam, she **would go** / **went** to university
- 4 She **were** / **would be** happier if she **had** / **would have** more money.
- 5 I **wouldn't do** / **didn't do** that if I **were** / **would be** you.
- 6 If you **knew** / **would know** the answer, you **were** / **would be** rich.
- 7 If you **would go** / **went** to bed earlier, you **were** / **would be** less tired.
- 8 Everybody **would run** / **ran** away if a lion **would escape** / **escaped** from the zoo.

## Wish (I wish + past simple)

- 1 I wish I \_\_\_\_\_ (be) less shy.
- 2 I wish I \_\_\_\_\_ (have) more money to buy a car.
- 3 I wish I \_\_\_\_\_ (not / work) too hard last week. I'm exhausted.
- 4 I wish you \_\_\_\_\_ (live) closer to my house.
- 5 I wish I \_\_\_\_\_ (can) fly.
- 6 I wish I \_\_\_\_\_ (meet) my favorite singer.
- 7 Helen wishes she \_\_\_\_\_ (swim) very well.
