Present perfect continuous tense expresses the action which is occurred in the past, and they proceed in the current situation or maybe in the future.

Subject + have/has + been + verb (ing) + object

I have been working on this since March

Subject + have/has + not + been + verb (ing) + object

I haven't been working on this since March

Have/has + subject + been + verb (ing) + object + ?

Have I been working on this since March?
