Use Past Simple to talk about single actions, permanent situations and habits in the past

Use Past Continuous to talk about actions in progress, temporary and changing situations in the past.

At this time yesterday
At 5 o'clock last Sunday
while

Form:
(+) + verb in the past

(-) + didn't + infinitive verb

(?) Did + + infinitive verb...?

*emphatic past: + did+ infinitive verb

Form:
(+) + was/were + ing form

(-) + wasn't/weren't + ing form

(?) Was/Were + + ing form...?

I read a book yesterday.
I met Sally last year.

I was reading a book at 3 o'clock yesterday.
I met her while I was visiting London.

when + past simple
while + past continuous

Use USED TO to talk about things you did in the past but don't do now, or things you didn't do in the past but you do now.

I **used to** like running when I was a child (I don't any more)

(+) + used to + infinitive verb

(-) + didn't use to + infinitive verb

(?) Did + + use to + infinitive verb...?
