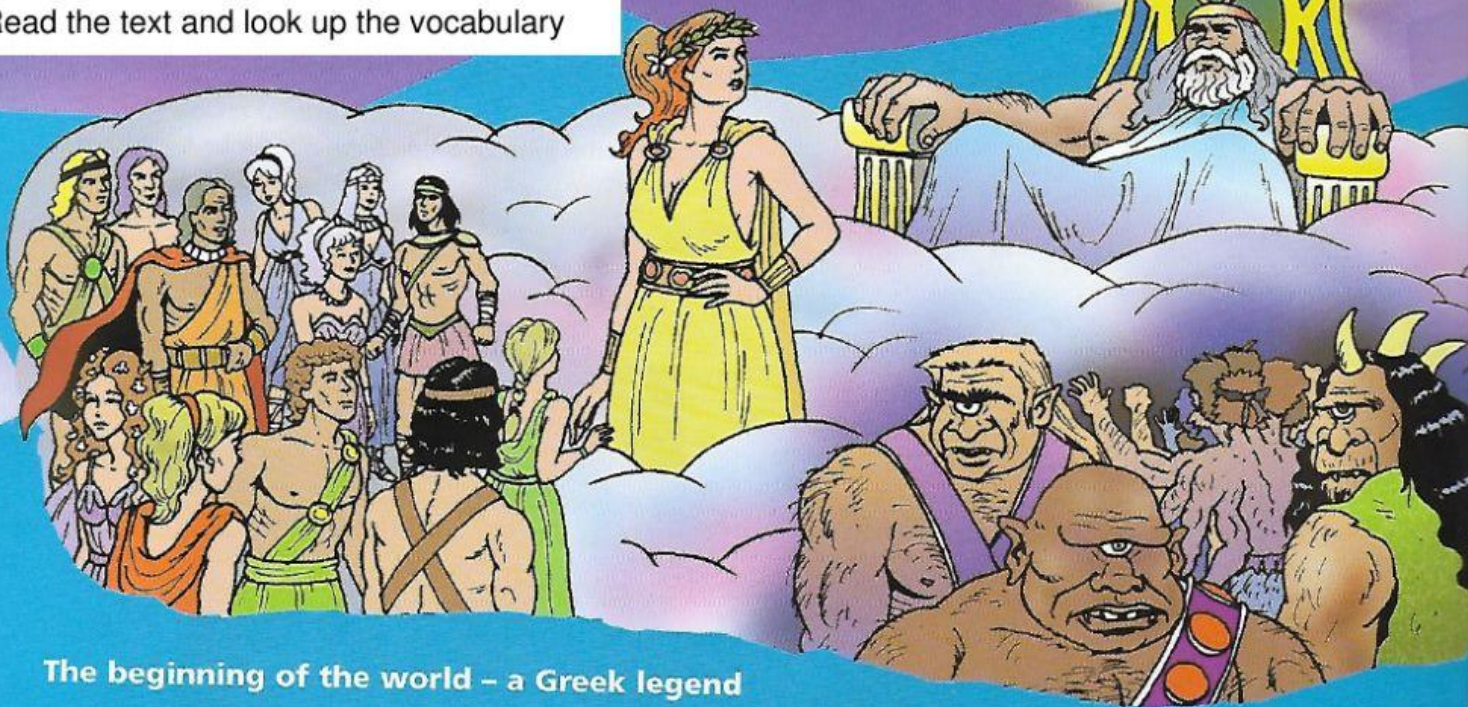
Our aim

The beginning of the world – a Greek legend

Mother Earth was good and beautiful and she married Uranus, the sky. **He** (1) was big and strong. He was the lord of the universe.

Mother Earth and Uranus had twelve children, the Titans. **They** (2) were the first gods. They were tall and handsome. There were six brothers and six sisters. Then Mother Earth had six more sons, the Cyclopes and the Giants. But they weren't handsome. They were very ugly. The Cyclopes had only one eye and the Giants had fifty heads and a hundred arms. They were horrible monsters!

Uranus didn't like his monster sons so he took **them** (3) to a dark prison in the centre of the earth.

Mother Earth was sad. **She** (4) loved her children. 'Go and rescue your monster brothers,' she said to her handsome sons, the Titans. But only one Titan, Cronus, obeyed his mother. The other Titans were very afraid of their strong father, Uranus.

There was a fierce battle between Cronus and Uranus. Cronus beat his father and he was the new lord of the universe. Then Mother Earth married Pontus, the sea, and she created trees, flowers, animals and people.

Cronus lived with his brothers, the Titans, and his wife, Rhea, on top of Mount Olympus. Mother Earth was angry with Cronus. **He** (5) didn't free his monster brothers and he wasn't a good father. 'I beat my father. Now my children can beat me,' said Cronus. So he ate his children. When Cronus's wife Rhea had her sixth son, Zeus, **she** (6) took the baby to the island of Crete and she gave Cronus a stone in baby clothes. Cronus ate the stone.

Zeus grew up on the island but Cronus didn't know his son Zeus was alive.
