On Android **phones**, you'll even be able to hear their roars and thuds of footsteps.

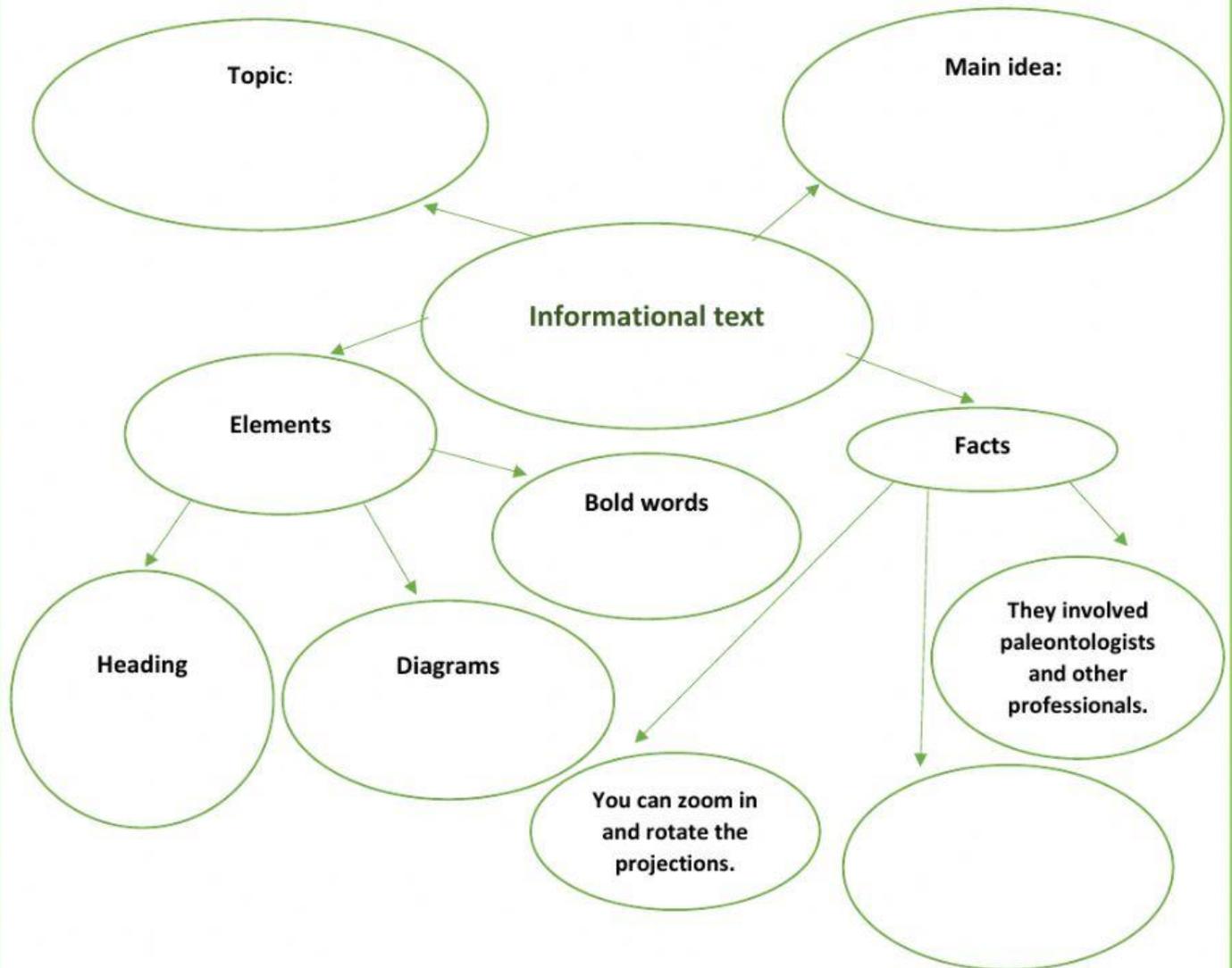
It's thanks to a Google partnership with 3D designers at Ludia, Amblin Entertainment and Universal Brand Development.
