



# WANT TO / NEED TO

---

- **want to** and **need to** are stative verbs which means that they cannot go with -ing  
**NOT** (*wanting to / needing to*)



I/You/We/They want **to** + infinitive  
He/She/It wants **s to** + infinitive



I/You/We/They **don't** want **to** + infinitive  
He/She/It **doesn't** want **to** + infinitive



**Do** I/you/we/they want **to** + infinitive  
**Does** he/she/it want **to** + infinitive

## Ex.1 - affirmative sentences

1. Mary \_\_\_\_\_ (need/wash) the dishes before her mum will get home.
2. My mum and I \_\_\_\_\_ (want/buy) a new board game.
3. Tom \_\_\_\_\_ (want/cook) something for his girlfriend.
4. I \_\_\_\_\_ (need/study) a bit more for the exam.
5. My sister \_\_\_\_\_ (need/go) to school by bus.

## Ex.2 - negative sentences

1. She \_\_\_\_\_ (not need/iron) her clothes.
2. My parents \_\_\_\_\_ (not want/play) my new board game.
3. He \_\_\_\_\_ (not want/eat) eat pizza all the time.
4. I \_\_\_\_\_ (not need/study) more for the exam.
5. My sister \_\_\_\_\_ (not need/go) to school by car.

### Ex.3 - questions

1. \_\_\_\_\_ he \_\_\_\_\_ (need/call) his mum this evening?
2. \_\_\_\_\_ your brother \_\_\_\_\_ (want/hang out) with us?
3. \_\_\_\_\_ you \_\_\_\_\_ (want/come) to my house?
4. \_\_\_\_\_ we \_\_\_\_\_ (need/ hand in) our exams now?
5. \_\_\_\_\_ they \_\_\_\_\_ (want/go) to the cinema?
6. \_\_\_\_\_ she \_\_\_\_\_ (need/talk) someone?
