

## More Adverbs That Compare

### RULES

An **adverb** can compare two or more actions.

Use **more** or **most** with adverbs that end in -ly and with long adverbs.

Nina packed **more** carefully than Dan.

Jim packed the **most** skillfully of all.

Use more to compare two actions. Use most to compare more than two actions. Do not use more or most with an adverb ending with -er or -est.

Eric dressed **quickly**.

Cindy dressed **more quickly** than Eric.

Alex dressed the **most quickly** of all.
